Amelia Earhart

Who Was Amelia Earhart?

Amelia Mary Earhart was born on 24th July 1897. She was famous for being the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. She broke many records and showed women that it was possible to follow their dreams.

What Was Her Early Life Like?

Amelia was born in Kansas, USA. She was an adventurous child who loved to spend time outside. Her parents encouraged her to take part in games and hobbies, such as football and fishing. This was unusual at the time because these hobbies were mostly done by boys. Amelia was inspired to become a pilot by watching air shows and going on short rides with a pilot. Pilots were mainly male during this time.

What Did Amelia Achieve?

Amelia Earhart achieved many new things during her career as a pilot. Some of these are shown in this timeline.

1921

Amelia became a pilot.

1922

Amelia reached an **altitude** record of 14,000 feet.

1929

She created an organisation of female pilots.

1930

Amelia set a women's speed record of 181 miles per hour.

1931


She set another altitude record of 18,451 feet.

1932

She was the first woman to successfully fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean.

1935

Amelia became the first woman to fly solo across the Pacific Ocean.

What Happened to Amelia?

Amelia wanted to become the first person to fly around the world. She took off on 1st June 1937 from the USA. Many of her experiences made it into the newspapers. She had travelled 22,000 miles when she landed in New Guinea on 30th June. The next day, Amelia set off for her next destination but her plane mysteriously disappeared. Amelia was declared lost at sea.

Why Was Amelia Important?

Years ago, many women were not allowed to do the same things as men. Amelia's courage inspired other women to follow their dreams. She showed that women could achieve great things and many people think of her as a hero of the 20th century.

Who Was Amelia Earhart?



Born on 24th July 1897, Amelia Earhart was an **aviation pioneer** and author. She is famous for being the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. Amelia was the one of the first women to become a pilot and she wrote two books about her adventures and experiences.

What Was Her Early Life Like?

Amelia was born in Kansas, USA. As a child, she had an adventurous spirit and loved to spend time outside. She would climb trees and hunt rats with her sister, Muriel. Unusually for this time, Amelia's parents encouraged her to take part in games and hobbies, such as football and fishing. Watching air shows and short rides in an aircraft inspired Amelia to become a pilot. Pilots were mainly male during this time.

What Did Amelia Achieve?

Amelia Earhart achieved many honours, awards and achievements during her career. Some of her successes are shown in the timeline below.






