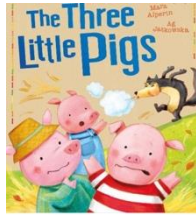


Nursery home learning 22/06/20 – The Three Little Pigs



Recap the story of The Three Little Pigs and discuss the characters and the plot together.
What happened at the start of the story, the middle and the end of the story?
What was your favourite part and why?

Have a go at this weeks activities:

- What makes a pig, a pig? Can you research a pig, what are baby pigs called? what is a snout? What are pigs feet called? Are all pigs pink?
- Draw or paint your own pig picture. What makes a pig, a pig. Two pointy ears, a snout for a nose and a curly whirly tail. Can you label your pig picture?
- Make your own model pig using recycling materials from your house. You could use a tube for its body, a straw cut up for its legs and a button for it's nose. Using your model pig could you retell the story of The Three Little Pigs.
- Have a go at learning the five little pigs song <https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=ei0ulZu9 WE> can you remember what each pig did? There are some simple nursery rhymes for you to listen to <https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=32j0pNrgzyY&t=418s>
- Do you think you could be like a little piglet today and instead of jumping on the bed, could you put on your wellington boots and go outdoors and splash in some puddles, if you don't have any puddles how could we make some? The muddier the better!
- **ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIRED!!** Cutting, fine motor skills. Using a piece of paper draw a small pig on one edge and a house on the other. Then draw a line/path from the piglet to the house. Using scissors try to cut along the path to the house.
- How did you get on learning about syllables? Let's think of words with one syllable and words with two syllables. How many syllables does your name have? <https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=HKxAjCqc3wU>
- Watch ten town number 10! Watch the video and have a go at the online games and activities.
- Practise writing the number 10. Can you collage your number 10 using different items, maybe you could find 10 items around your house, 10 tissues or pencils. Can you remember to stop at 10.
