Questions to discuss-

- What did the caterpillar pop out of?
- How do you think the caterpillar felt at the start of the story?
- How did the caterpillar move?
- What was your favourite food that the caterpillar ate?
- Why do you think the caterpillar was so hungry?
- What was the last thing the caterpillar ate before he became full?
- What have you eaten that you have felt a little bit sick because you ate too much?
- How do you think the caterpillar felt in the cocoon?
- How would you describe the butterfly?
- How do you think the caterpillar felt when it turned into a butterfly?

Activities

- Have a go at the caterpillar count activities on top marks.

- Write a list of all the different foods the caterpillar ate.
- Using some recycling items see if you can make your very own caterpillar.
- Have a go at exercising like a butterfly by following the link below.

- Sequence your own caterpillar with different coloured circles.
- If you have a garden, outdoor area or if you go on a walk see if you can go on a mini beast hunt and see what you can find. Does it wiggle, does it crawl, how does it move? (due to social distancing please only allow your child to touch mini beasts if you are happy for them to. The children do not need to touch the mini beasts to complete this activity you can google them online if preferred).
- Listening activity, what was that noise? Ask an adult/ sibling to hide an item behind their back and see if you can work out what it is. Items you could use for example keys, crisp packet, an instrument.
