English

Reading: We will be reading The Firework-maker's

Daughter this half term as well as reading some nonfiction texts related to our Topic. We will be
developing and applying a range of comprehension
skills including retrieval, inference, prediction,
summary, explaining and our understanding of some
of the wonderful vocabulary in this text.

<u>Writing</u>: We will continue to use descriptive language and different sentence structures, using the list of 3: expanded noun phrases, dialogue and prepositions to innovate a known story focusing on creating an interesting ending.

<u>Spelling:</u> We will be working on the Year3/4 spelling words and continuing with prefixes and suffixes.

Music

'Compose using your imagination'. We will be developing the following Musical Skills: singing and listening, playing and improvising and composing using a selection of these notes: C, D, E, F, F♯, G, G♯, A, B

PSHE & RE

Our key question for enquiry in Religious Education lessons is 'Could Jesus heal people? Were these miracles or is there some other explanation?'.

In PSHE, our topic is 'Celebrating Difference'. This focuses on similarities and differences and teaches about diversity, such as disability, racism, power, friendships, and conflict; children learn to accept everyone's right to 'difference', and explore the concept of 'normal'; bullying – what it is and what it isn't.

Art

We will be exploring making tints with primary and secondary colours, looking at work by Vincent Van Gogh and Sean Scully and attempting to recreate their styles of painting. Year 3 will also experiment with the techniques 'Tonking' and 'Sgraffito'.

MFL

Playground games, numbers and ages will allow Year Three to develop their spoken French language.



Maths

This half term we will continue with multiplication and division focusing on multiplying a 2-digit by a 1-digit number with no exchanging and exchanging, dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number using no exchanging, flexible partitioning and remainders. We will then begin to cover length and perimeter.

Key maths vocabulary

multiplication, multiply, multiplying, times, multiple, divide, division, divisible, connection, same, different, difference, calculation, sum, amount, digit, single digit, place value, partitioned, part-whole, shared, flexible partitioning, exchange, remainder, length, perimeter, measure, centimetres, metres.

Physical Education – Dance

Children will develop their use of counting and rhythm, they will learn to use canon, unison, formation and levels in their dances. They will be given the opportunity to perform to others and provide feedback using key terminology.

History & Geography

Our new topic is called 'Tremors'. This topic starts with the events of the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD79 and looking at how good sources of evidence are and what makes a good source of evidence and also how we can make deductions about events in th past from these. The rest of the topic is based around natural disasters and finding out what they are, how the occur and why they occur. Year 3 will learn more about earthquakes, tsunamis, and volcanoes whilst revising knowledge about directions on a compass up to 8 points (N, NE, E, SE, S, SW, W, NW, N)

Computing

'Programming Scratch', is our topic this half term. Children will be developing skills on how to use loops, animation, story telling and programming a game.

Science

Our topic in Science is 'Rocks'. We will be learning about the different types of rocks including manmade and natural: igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary. We will be carrying out a variety of investigations to explore the properties of different rocks including permeability, durability, density. We will also be learning how fossils are formed, how soil is formed and will be applying what we know about this process to make our very own compost.
