PSHE: Celebrating difference

Judging by appearances, understanding influences, understanding bullying, problem solving, special me and celebrating difference: how we look.

Science: States of matter

Develop and showcase an understanding of all areas of states of matter, including how materials can change from one state to another, through a large range of simple practical enquiries.

Maths

Area: Children are learning that area is the amount of space taken up by a two-dimensional shape or surface. They are exploring different ways of working out the area of a shape and that some ways are better than others.

Multiplication and division: Children will be exploring the link between counting in 3s, 6s, 9s, 7s, 11s and the corresponding multiplication and division facts.

Physical Education: Gymnastics

Pupils are developing balancing, rolling, jumping and inverted movements and using these skills to create more complex sequences. Pupils are taught to demonstrate control in their behaviour to create a safe environment to work in.

Music

Both classes are learning musical notation and the correct breathing techniques to produce notes on their chosen musical instruments.
