Sports Premium

Background

- In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.
- Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils, including: primary, middle, special and non-maintained special schools, academies and pupil referral units from 1 September 2016. A typical primary school will receive about £8,000 annually plus £5 per pupil in the academic years 2015/16 and 2016/17.
- Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Primary School's Sports Funding for Heathlands Primary Academy £9,795 for 2014/2015/2016

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs
- How Heathlands intends to spend the sports funding during 2014-2015 from 1/9/2014 to 31/8/2015 = £9,795

1. Purchased services of Aspire through 2014/15 and continuing into 2015/16 committed in salary costs

The school has employed the services of skilled specialist coaches through 'AspireSports' for the whole academic year Sept 2014- Sept 2015, to take classes and work alongside staff in the delivery of PE lessons including: multi-sports and athletics.

The outcome will be to improve the standards and opportunities for the pupils and improve class teachers' teaching in PE through the hands on daily PE support and ideas during PE sessions throughout the year. This initiative will benefit the children from Year1 to Year 6. The Coaches are also excellent role models for all children, not only benefiting during Curriculum PE sessions, but also through their attendance at our Breakfast Club, which takes place before school begins.

2. Providing opportunities for increased numbers of pupils to participate in after school sport clubs and interschool competitive fixtures

Our school now offers a multi-sport after school club for years 1 to 4 throughout the academic year. The Sports Funding has enabled us to offer a variety of sporting opportunities to a greater number of

children after school, competitively and free places to all children. During the summer months this will change to Athletics and a different variety of Multi skills activities.

Within the Saltley league, boys and girls from years 5 and 6, in conjunction with other primary schools in the area, the Sports Funding pays for the arrangement of football tournaments and fixtures between the cluster primaries. We feel it is important that children are given the chance to participate against others of a similar sporting ability and potential.

3. Purchased quality resources

Purchased games resources, balls, nets, posts and gymnastic mats and storage trolley to allow for quality and sustained PE sessions during curriculum time.
